I wanted audiences to walk away from the film debating whether the decision Diya makes, given the context she was in, was the right one.

His first feature-length screenplay, "The Dennis Boys," won the Oscar Micheaux Award for excellence in screenwriting by the Greater Philadelphia Film Office.
